Softball Equipment Buying Recommendations

- The league supplies each team with a shared bat and helmet. However, many parents choose to purchase these items for their child (parent's preference).
- Some suggestions when buying rec softball equipment:
 - 1) Make sure it fits. There is a tendency to buy things that are too big with the philosophy that girls will grow into it. Unfortunately, this strategy sometimes backfires: the bats are then too heavy, the helmets are too loose, the cleats are too big and the players trip when running, etc.
 - 2) Buy it on-sale!
 - 3) FIRST THING...put your name on everything!
- Dick's carries all of the top manufacturers you can't go wrong. (Watch for their discount coupons.) At this age many of the buying decisions are not based on the brand, but rather player's favorite colors.
- Have the experts at Dick's, or a local retailer fit the girls for the appropriate size for bats, gloves, helmets, and cleats.
- Although not required equipment, buy a face mask for the field...it protects the girls when they are playing and they learn to catch much faster because they feel safer!
